> for her part played in supplying war and poverty-stricken countries with adequate clothing, blankets and accessories.

A formidable partnership between Government, community and the business and finance sectors has led to a scholarship worth almost \$600,000 for Aboriginal business of the barr

The Deputy Premier and Minister for Aboriginal Affairs, Dr. Andrew Refshauge, launched the initiative called the Freddy Fricke Scholarship Fund.

"This Scholarship will make a solid contribution to addressing one

of the barriers to Aboriginal enterprise business success – the lack of finance skills and expertise by many Aboriginal people in NSW".

"Two years ago a generous Australian concerned for the "underdogs" of society left his Bondi home to the NSW Aboriginal Land Council (NSW ALC). His name was

Freddy Fricke", said Dr. Refshauge. NSWALC has used the total of \$537,000 raised from the sale of Mr. Fricke's home as the capital base of the Scholarship Fund.

Scholarships worth \$10,000 a year for three years will be presented to successful applicants for tertiary study in finance and commer-

ce-related disciplines. "It is not surprising that this initiative has attracted financial commitments of \$40,000 from both the Commonwealth Department of Education Science and Training and from Deutsche Asset Management", said Dr. Refshauge.

"The Freddy Fricke Scholarship
