



**Message for FOREWORD OF CAVALIERE DINO GUSTIN J.P.'S BOOK

In June 1999 I was pleased to be present when Signora (Mamma) Lena Gustin was invested with the high honour of Commendatore of the Order of Merit of the Italian Republic. The award formally recognised Signora Gustin's services to the Italian-speaking community in journalism, broadcasting, education and business. It was an honour of 'two worlds', coming from the country of her birth in recognition of her work in her adopted country.

In 1998 I attended the unveiling of the bronze bust of Signora Gustin whose inscription reminds its reader of her contribution in the 'difficult years' of emigration to Australia.
