Downer's Promises to his "Mamma"

It was a foundation his father laid 34 years ago, and Liberal leader Alexander Downer built on it yesterday by cementing ties with Australia's Italian community at the Apia Club in Leichhardt.

Sir Alexander Downer laid the first foundation stone of the club when he was immigration Minister in the Menzies Government.

So Mr Downer used the family link to show his commitment to the Italian community and the principles of multiculturalism.

He and his wife Nicky were helping celebrate the 80th birthday of one of the Italian community's living legends - radio and print journalist and long-time activist "Mamma Lena" Morelli.

Opposition health spokeswoman Bronwyn Bishop was also among the guests, and Prime Minister Paul Keating and NSW Premier John Fahey sent their congratulations.

Mamma Lena is known for her newspaper columns, radio shows,

political lobbying and the help she has given thousands of fellow immigrants.

She has been decorated by both the Australian and Italian governments for her services to the Italian community in Australia since arriving in 1956.

Mr Downer promised the 700 guests that a Liberal government would be committed to the principles of multiculturalism. He said: "For my Party, we very much in the years ahead want to build on our achievements in the areas of both immigration and multi-cultural affairs."

"I always looked upon immigration as part of the process of nation building and developing Australia."

"Multiculturalism in Australia is really part of the great and unique diversity of this country, and it's something that we all want to cherish."
