The State Emergency Service is based on volunteer help and members are obliged to take several courses to train them should a disaster occur.

An exhibition and sale of paintings by Australian artists will also be shown at the town hall. Proceeds are to go towards a low rental housing scheme for the aged and handicapped. Tickets are available at all Mitchell Bass outlets.

**ELIZABETH** State MP Pat Hills recently officiated at a public demonstration in Glebe of a new taxi for the disabled.

The special purpose vehicle, which takes six passengers plus one wheelchair which is fitted with a lifting platform at the rear, is the first of 80 planned for Sydney.

Each cab co-operative will run two per 100 vehicles in its fleet.

Hills said the State Government had given \$600,000 for the scheme last year, The Year of the Disabled, and envisages the figure increasing to \$2.6 million by 1984.

Ken Ryan, a spokesman for Legion Cabs which demonstrated the vehicle at the Glebe annexe of Balmmain Hospital, said the vehicles are for people unable to use normal public transport.

They will get half-fare by applying to the Urban Transit Authority.

The taxis can multiple-hire which means members of a group, such as nursing home patients, can travel for a fraction of normal taxi fares.

• **WELL** known Italian community leader "Mamma" Lena Gustin is one of the 12 candidates in the Lowe Federal by-election next month.

A social worker-radio broadcaster - journalist-migrant spokeswoman and former teacher who speaks Spanish, Italian, French and English, Gustin is expected to catch a solid portion of the substantial migrant vote in the electorate.

The area sports one of the highest concentrations of Italians in Sydney.

She has been dubbed "Mamma" for her warm personality and welfare work.

Of the 12 candidates, only four live in the electorate — Michael Maher (ALP), Phil Taylor (Liberal), controversial ex-Strathfield alderman Peter Conundine (Constitutional Reform) and Stephen Kirkham, (Australian Democrats).

Others come from as far afield as Liverpool, Monterey, Broken Hill, Turrumulla and Bellevue Hill.

Labor needs a 1.2 per cent swing to win the seat.

Party affiliations will not be shown on the ballot paper.

Voters will have to number every candidate in order of preference to make their vote valid.

### BERNADETTE TALKS HAIR



### DEAN TRIMBLE TALKS HAIR

NO matter what I use on it, my hair is always dry and dull. How can I get it smooth and shiny?

Some hair, particularly naturally curly hair, by the nature of its composition, doesn't allow the light to reflect and retract from it — so it looks dull. If you use poor hair products, too much heat in setting hair, you'll de-moisturise it so it becomes even dryer looking and if you're not careful how you handle it, the outer cuticle layer of each strand of hair will become rough, which again prevents the light from reflecting off it. You need to keep these outer cuticle layers in a compact position by using products that will smooth them down — in other words, very good shampoos and conditioners such as the "high tech" ones from L'Oreal Kerastase range which represents the latest kind of thinking about hair.

You may not be able to get hair that's naturally dry and dull to look totally smooth and shiny, but there's a good chance you can improve its appearance a lot. One product I particularly like is the L'Oreal Kerastase Hair Masque with oil of corn germ. It really polishes dull hair.

My hair is definitely thinning and I am terrified I'm going bald. What can I do about it? Is it permanent?

Temporary hair loss is quite common following illness, severe weight loss, certain drugs (including the Pill), anaesthetics, X-ray therapy of the head and childbirth. Some women certainly report thinning of the hair with age, too, and this seems to be the same condition as male baldness, although it doesn't progress to the same extent.

Any situation that affects the body's metabolism or endocrine system adversely may contribute to hair loss, because it increases the number of hairs that are in the "resting" phase of the growth cycle. Hair grows in cycles like this — there's a long period of growth, then a short resting period when the hair stops growing and is shed. In a few months, the growing cycle starts again and new hairs begin to grow.

Hair may become thin through bad perming or colouring when the hair just breaks off close to the scalp. This isn't a serious situation, as the hair root isn't affected, although it does take a long time for hair to grow back again. Thinning hair needs to be handled carefully to prevent further loss. It should be brushed very carefully, never tugged or pulled and a good diet should be followed to encourage hair growth and proper circulation.
