

Mamma Lena Child Care Centre

THE STORY OF THE MAMMA LENA CHILD CARE CENTRE

Mamma Lena was 69 when the Centre was officially opened on the 28th April 1989. Behind the scenes are almost 20 years of beurocratic battles to make it happen. Why and how it was built is not easy to explain. Perhaps a short introduction of Mamma Lena will help put it all in context.

Lena Gustin arrived in Australia with her family in 1956. At the time she was 42, a mother of three (the first deceased), a teacher, a hotel manager and, together with her husband Dino, a presenter of variety shows. A few days after landing in Sydney, fate would have it that her destiny as the guardian angel of a whole generation of Italian migrants was scaled. She was asked to write an "agony aunt" column in the Italian newspaper "La Fiamma" and shortly after was asked to conduct a one-hour radio program on 2SM. From 2SM she moved to 2CH where the programs, produced by Dino, grew to three hours per day with an unprecedented 12.5% foreign language content. Later the program went to 2KY – where Italian music and messages had to be shared with dog and horse races. Lena also became the President of the National Association of Migrant Families (ANFE). Each of her many activities enabled her to help thousands of new immigrants assimilate into the Australian way of life. Along the way she became "Mamma Lena", mother to the Italian community.

In 1963, and in conjunction with a radio program of the same name, she and Dino founded the "Sorella Radio Welfare Fund" with the aim of providing assistance to individuals or groups in need. For her work Mamma Lena was later to be awarded the Italian Title of Cavaliere in 1967, the MBE in 1968 and the title of Commendatore (Italy's highest award) in 2000.

As President of ANFE, Mamma Lena and her committee were planning the construction of an aged care centre but in 1968, in the middle of planning the project, the Italian city of Sicily was hit by a devastating earthquake and fund raising was diverted to assist the thousands of displaced persons that the catastrophe created. Through Mamma Lena's radio programs the community was generous and the money raised was personally taken by Dino to the Sicilian town of Poggioreale where a child care centre for 100 children


was built to meet the needs of that stricken community.

It also became clear that Italian families in Sydney also needed child care facilities. Fairfield at the time was an obvious choice as many Italian families had settled in the Cabramatta/Fairfield

municipality.

In 1969 at a function at the Marconi Club also attended

by Janice Crosio and the Hon. Ferguson, the idea of a child care centre in Fairfield - to be called the "Sorella Radio Child Care Centre" - was mentioned. Janice Crosio at the time was the President of the Ladies Committee of the Marconi Club. She was later to become Mayor of Fairfield and a State and Federal Member of Parliament and throughout her political career she has been a great supporter of Mamma Lena and the Centre. In 1970 fund raising for the Sorella Radio Child Care Centre begins in earnest. At the time when listeners to Mamma Lena's radio programs wrote to her requesting a song or a special greeting, they usually included a couple of dollars in the letter. This money was set aside for the Centre. Every time a function was organized, the money raised was set aside for the Centre. A house at 4 Hampton Street Fairfield was purchased and demolished and architect Gino Volpato was commissioned to draw up the plans for the Centre - as seen on the right - only to see them





modern". Over many years the plans were modified and finally accepted but not without controversy as seen in the newspaper article of the time. Eventually, and with the help of the Hon. Janice Crosio, the Federal Government granted \$160,000 to build the Centre. Finally, in 1979 the laying of the first stone at a ceremony attended by hundreds of guests among whom the Hon. Janice Crosio, Senator Bonner representing the Federal Government, the Italian authorities, memebers of the Sorella Radio committee; Nick Scali, George La Paine, Lorenzo Marchetto, Mamma Lena, Father Mantovani and Dino Gustin. A company called FAXIS had been given the job of constructing the Centre. Work begins with the construction of the Walls, roof, windows and doors and then stops. The treasurer, George La Paine regretfully informs the Committee that the money has run out.

For a year and a half, the Centre is left half completed and

looks a sorry sight. The authorities were not able to help and, left in that state, the Centre was a tangible reminder of shattered dreams and a black mark against the Italian community.


Foundation step laid for centre and for a pair of the foundation of child care centre at Hamilton Street, Falifield.

On the 1st April 1980 came the turning point. The Sorella Radio Committee comprising of Nick Scali, George La Paine, Joe Finn, Dino Gustin, Lorenzo Marchetto and Mamma Lena, met at the premises of the Italian Chamber of Commerce which, at that time, was in Leichhardt.

Dino makes a momentous decision. He will take on the responsibility of finishing the Centre with the help of volunteers!

Dino mobilized everyone in the Italian community. Dozens of people and firms pledged their support. With love and a big Italian heart Dino and his team turned a desperate situation into a winner.





It is fitting that we remember some of these unsung heroes because without their commitment the Child Care centre would certainly not be standing.

(We list the major volunteers in alphabetical order)

Santo TORRESAN who with his son Domenico would come every weekend to Build fences, gates and columns.



In 1983-84 funds were still a problem and the Centre was struggling financially. As a fund-raiser, Dino organized a "Miss Charity Queen" pageant. As seen below, 12 young "princesses" entered the contest and for 12 weeks Mamma Lena featured one of them in turn on her radio programs. This helped to introduce the contestants to the community at large and to explain the importance of the funds to the Centre.

The event was coordinated by Mrs. Vicki Fonatana and the winner was Grazia Marson who raised \$14,000 for the Centre. Like her father, Grazia did all she could to ensure that the Centre was successful.

Sorella Radio first went on air 20 years ago. The warm friendly voice of Mamma Lena became a link with home for thousands of Italian families

The Sorella Child Care Centre in Hampton St, Fairfield opens officially next month for infants and children from birth to 5 years of

Any parent wishing to enrol their child should contact the director of the centre Debbie Watson on 727 6324. 1985 was a time of upheaval for the Committee. Nick Scali and George La Paine resigned because they considered their task had come to an end and the Secretary, Renzo Marchetto and his wife Emily went to live in the Blue Mountains, Giuseppe Calabro' needed to go interstate for business, Fr. Mantovani was transferred to Italy and Mr. Taccori unfortunately died.

Mamma Lena, Dino Gustin and Maria Coco were still part of the Committee but new members were urgently needed. Mrs. Vicki Fontana and Mr. Mario Mura joined the Committee and became the Vice President and Secretary respectively. Another blow was the resignation of our first Director Debbie Watson. Her place was filled by Mrs. Lorraine Vagli who, to this day, is still the Centre's Director.

The Centre was doing well and the list of children waiting admittance was growing. The problem, however, was the lack of paying area and in the late 80's the opportunity arose to purchase the house next door. This immediately doubled the children's play area and the Committee thought that the house would make an ideal Community Centre for the Italians in the area.

The Community Centre remained a dream and the pressure of children on the waiting list made the Committee reconsider its plans. The house would be demolished and the Centre would be expanded. In 1993 architect Arnaldo Bello was approached to draw plans for the extension and the plans were launched on the 31st October 1993 for all to see. However, it would be a few years before the project came to fruition. In the meantime, in July 1995 the Sorella Radio Child Care Centre had changed its name to the Mamma Lena Child Care Centre,

In 1997, after changes of architect and plans, and a sizeable grant from the government, construction on the new extension finally begins. Mamma Lena and Dino are totally unaware of what is happening as Dino was critically ill in hospital at the time and it would be at least a year before he and Mamma Lena see the new wing which was officially opened

in April 1999. The Centre would now have a apacity of 65 children with a totally new baby's wing - the "Bunny" room.


